Urgent Action on Climate Change

This CLP notes:

The Climate Crisis

- kills and displaces frightening numbers of people annually;
- disproportionately affects those populations least responsible;
- reflects the imminent expiry of the UK's carbon budget in 2 years.

The Fossil Fuel Industry

- knowingly causes climate breakdown;
- attempts prolongation by green-washing, intense lobbying and investment in <u>unproven technologies</u>;
- lacks carbon zero business models.

The Tory Government

- in joining <u>CPTPP</u> fails to advance policies curtailing fossil-fuel industry profitability;
- has ill-defined climate targets and protects fossil fuel interests.

Labour's plans

- show the way, but need to be much bolder.

We believe:

There is no time left to play the fossil-fuel survival game.

There *is* time left for sufficient alternative, globally equitable, energy development with speedier, more cost-effective solutions.

We call upon Labour to:

- 1. Support the <u>Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty</u> and amend other treaties and trade agreements accordingly;
- 2. Reduce all fossil-fuel use, and exports, by 74% by 2030;
- 3. Switch all public domestic and international investment from fossil fuels into renewable energy and energy conservation by 2030, capable of ensuring a sufficiency of alternative green energy production;
- 4. Deliver devolution with social justice and end fuel poverty via democratic, decentralised, localised energy development, eg. solar, wind, geothermal, tidal, green hydrogen;

- 5. Ensure a just transition for all workers from fossil-fuel-dependent to sustainable, equitable, renewables-based employment;
- 6. Double Labour's commitments to an £8bn wealth and £28bn annual climate fund.
